Municipality Fiscal Budget Compliance

WVSAO is unable to accept the proposed levy rates for the municipalities of Terra Alta (Preston County) and Reedy (Roane County) due to noncompliance with provisions of West Virginia Code. Smithfield (Wetzel County) submitted a budget with conditional approval and are working toward full approval.
